Important Reminders & Updates:

Keeping Our Students Safe

Parents and guardians are asked to practise caution when dropping and picking up their children. Safety starts with us and everyone has the responsibility to practise safe, conscientious driving habits when at school. We expect all adults to be courteous and respectful of one another in this regard. Ensure that you:

Follow the speed limit, SLOW DOWN & DRIVE WITH CAUTION

Do not stop in front of the entrance driveway area to drop off your kids as this causes a backup in traffic and leads to our school buses arriving late.

We encourage parents to park a couple of blocks away in a safe and less congested area and walk to the school with their children. This will decrease the amount of traffic at the front of the school, ensure student safety and practise healthy living habits. We need your collective cooperation to make student safety a priority. Together we can make our school community safe for everyone.

The Importance of Punctuality

Parents are responsible for ensuring that their child attends school <u>regularly and punctually</u>. Being punctual is an important life skill. When your child is late, it causes disruption to the learning experience that has begun in the classroom & could result in your child missing important information. In addition to the legal requirements for mandatory and punctual attendance, research continues to prove that absenteeism/lateness has a negative impact on the ability of a student to be successful in school. By helping your child to establish positive attendance patterns we can assist them in reaching their full learning potential. Please ensure your child arrives at school between 8:45 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. If your child arrives after the bell, parents MUST walk them to the front door and wait for a staff member to open the door.

Lunch Routines

A reminder that students who go home for lunch must get this permission from a parent or guardian. A letter will be sent home for parent signature for students who walk home for lunch. It is important to note that:

Pediculosis

SJN and our YCDSB work to ensure that all of our students are safe and well throughout the school year.
